GOALS

- Empower students to develop collaborative ethics for social interventions with child migrants and their families
- Build capacity for a critical analysis and reflection on the social, legal and emotional challenges faced by child migrants and their families
- Reflect deeply on social work practices with this target group, identifying areas for improvement and new intervention strategies, and promoting critical thinking from a rights-based approach
- Articulate and promote new professional ethics facilitating inclusion and integration to ensure social protection for child migrants in their host communities.

ONLINE COMPONENT

The training course will begin with a synchronous online teaching module running in March and April 2025 (20 hours of teaching and 15 hours of independent work, 1.2 ECTS) over the Microsoft TEAMS platform. The module comprises a total of five teaching sessions (20 hours in total) that will run before the face-to-face component. A final session will be held a few weeks later, following the training week at the UIB.

Session details (4 hours each, 9.30 am–1.30 pm CET):

- Session 1 (7th March 2025). Course and participant introductions. The current situation of child migrants at a global scale. Challenges for social work interventions.
- Session 2 (14th March 2025). The foundations of European asylum systems. Dublin III Regulation. Challenges and gaps. Rules and protections for unaccompanied refugee minors. Specific rules for unaccompanied refugees in each partner country.
- Session 3 (21st March 2025). Social work intervention models. Collaborative approaches. Strategies to establish a suitable alliance with children and families.
- Session 4 (28th March 2025). Group work interventions as a part of social work with child migrants, as well as family social work. Case studies and group interventions.
- **Session 5 (4th April 2025).** Emotional well-being and mental health of child migrants and their families. The psychological impacts from the migration process. Migratory grief. Intervention tools and techniques, including arts-based social work.

Following the online sessions, there will be a week of face-to-face training activities in Palma from 7th–11th April 2025 (Monday to Friday, 30 hours in total, 1.8 ECTS).
